



WEEK IN REVIEW

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 1959</u>: The 37th Infantry Division is reorganized under the Pentomic division structure.

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 1963</u>: Company C, 837th Engineer Battalion is organized in Oxford as Battery B, 1st Missile Battalion, 137th Artillery.

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 1994</u>: Detachment 21, Operational Support Airlift Command is organized in Columbus.

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 2005</u>: Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 112th Transportation Battalion is constituted in North Canton as the 731st Troop Command Detachment.

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 2005</u>: The Ohio National Guard launches Operation Buckeye in response to Hurricane Katrina. About 350 Soldiers of Joint Task Force Buckeye are transported to Louisiana on Ohio Air National Guard KC-135 and C-130 aircraft.

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 2007</u>: The 137th Signal Company is organized in Newark as the Signal Company, 371st Sustainment Brigade.

<u>SEPTEMBER 1, 2008</u>: The 1937th Support Detachment is constituted in Columbus.

<u>SEPTEMBER 2, 1945</u>: Japanese Gen. Tomoyuki Yamashita, commander of Japanese forces in the Philippines, surrenders to Maj. Gen. Robert S. Beightler, commanding general of the 37th Infantry Division.

FLIGHT SUIT MORALE PATCH

The flight suit morale patch was commissioned by Det. 21, Operational Support Airlift Command (OSACOM) during a 2006-2007 mobilization to Djibouti, Africa. The patch shows an outline of Africa with a U.S. Army C-26 aircraft, the type of plane flown by the unit. The Latin phrase "Es nos illic etiamnunc" translates to "Are we there yet". The area the crew would fly over during the mobilization was large and most of their flights were very long. When departing, the crew would frequently ask "Are we there yet".
