## WEEK IN REVIEW


<u>FEBRUARY 1, 1972</u>: The 196th Public Affairs Detachment is organized in Worthington as the 196th Public Information Detachment.

FEBRUARY 2, 1813: Gen. William Henry Harrison established Fort Meigs on the south side of the Maumee River. The fort was to serve as a temporary supply depot and staging area for an invasion of Canada and was home for more than 2,000 men consisting of U.S. regulars and militia from Ohio, Kentucky, Pennsylvania and Virginia.

<u>FEBRUARY 2, 1926</u>: The 812th Engineer Company is organized in Akron as Headquarters Company, 73d Infantry Brigade.

<u>FEBRUARY 5, 1942</u>: The 37th Infantry Division leaves Camp Shelby, Miss. for Fort Indiantown Gap, Pa.
