



WEEK IN REVIEW


FEBRUARY 23, 1847: American forces under Maj. Gen. Zachary Taylor defeat Mexican troops under Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna at the Battle of Buena Vista. The 2d and 3d Ohio Volunteer Infantry Regiments were active in the battle, guarding Taylor's supply depots and escorting wagon trains that were rushing needed supplies to the battle.

FEBRUARY 23-25, 1945: The assault on the walled city of Intramuros takes place, with elements of the 145th and 129th Infantry attacking the ancient Spanish fort within the city of Manila.

FEBRUARY 27, 1948: The 220th Engineering Installation Squadron is organized in Zanesville as the 105th Communications Squadron.

INTRAMUROS FIELD ORDER

The 145th Infantry published Field Order 13 on Feb. 22, 1945 directing the attack on Intramuros the next morning. The plan called for the 2d Battalion to make the main effort at the Quezon-Parian gates followed by the 1st Battalion while the 3rd Battalion established a support by fire position from adjacent buildings. The accompanying map overlay of Intramuros was produced by the regimental S2. The Quezon-Parian gates are located at the bottom of the map.
