1899	Disbanded 14 April 1899 ² Reorganized 21 July 1899 as Company B, 8th Infantry Regiment ³
1916	Mustered into Federal service 19 June 1916 at Camp Willis, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 22 March 1917 at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana
1917	Called into Federal service 15 July 1917; Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917 ⁴
	Reorganized and redesignated 15 September 1917 as Company B, 146th Infantry an element of the 37th Division ⁵
1919	Demobilized 19 April 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio ⁶

1920	Redesignated 2 August 1920 as Company B, 3d Infantry Regiment ⁸

- 1940 Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at Akron¹¹ (37th Division redesignated 1 February 1942 as the 37th Infantry Division)¹²
- **1945** Inactivated 13 December 1945 at Camp Anza, California 13
- 1947 Reorganized and Federally recognized 6 May 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Akron as Company I, 145th Infantry¹⁴
- 1952 Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Akron¹⁵
- (Company I, 145th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 15 January 1954)¹⁶

Released from active Federal service 15 June 1954 and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Company I, 145th Infantry (NGUS)¹⁷

- Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1959 as Company A, 2d Battle Group, 145th Infantry and relieved from assignment to the 37th Infantry Division¹⁸
- Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Company A, 3d Battalion, 145th Infantry, an element of the 37th Infantry Division 19
- Reorganized and redesignated 15 November 1965 as Company B, 2d Battalion, 145th Infantry and relieved from assignment to the 37th Infantry Division²⁰

1974 Location changed 1 January 1974 to Stow Converted, reorganized and redesignated 1 June 1974 as Troop I, 3d Squadron, 107th Armored Cavalry²² 1977 Consolidated 1 May 1977 with Howitzer Battery, 3d Squadron, 107th Armored Cavalry (see ANNEX); consolidated unit designated as Troop I, 3d Squadron, 107th Armored Cavalry²³ 1993 Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1993 as Company C, 1st Battalion, 107th Cavalry, an element of the 28th Infantry Division²⁴ 1994 (107th Cavalry assigned 1 September 1994 to the 38th Infantry Division)²⁵ 2002 (1st Battalion, 107th Cavalry assigned 1 September 2002 to the 28th Infantry Division) 2003 Ordered into active Federal service 1 October 2003 at Stow: released from active Federal service 28 March 2005 and reverted to state control²⁶ Redesignated 1 October 2005 as Company C, 1st Battalion, 2005 107th Cavalry Regiment²⁷ 2007 Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2007 as Company C, 1st Battalion, 145th Armored Regiment an element of the 2d Brigade Combat Team, 28th Infantry Division²⁸ 2008 Relieved 1 March 2008 from assignment to the 2d Brigade Combat Team. 28th Infantry Division; location changed to Alliance²⁹ Ordered into active Federal service 25 September 2008 at Alliance; released from active Federal service 29 October 2009 and reverted to state control³⁰ 2016 (145th Armored Regiment assigned 1 September 2016 to the




