From the State Family Program Director Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) Robert Bramlish

What's new? Well quite a bit. Let me quickly talk about our staffing, while the Joint Volunteer Council continues to provide leadership and guidance to our program; and our FAC staff focuses on working with deployed FRGs and developing local resources for military families and service members – we are hiring a full time family readiness staff member for each of the 5 Army major commands in Ohio. These team members will assist the month to month operations of their respective organization's FRG. Did you hear about how the Family Mobilization Briefs (FMB) has evolved in Ohio? Not only are the briefings more streamlined but the chaplains added a session called BATTLEMIND which mentors Service Member and spouse/family member on the rigors and changes that will take place before and during a mobilization. We like to say that we added something for the heart in our FMBs. Do you know about the new "Youth Camps" that are conducted on-site during the FMB for all kids 6-17 years old? We are the first state in the union to actually put on a program for the kids as part of the deployment process... team building and building resilient youth. Since we started this new program in SEP 07, we have had over 300 of your children attend... and they loved it! Just ask any spouse in the 37th IBCT who had their kids participate this past fall.

ATTENTION: The Adjutant General (TAG) is hosting 6 town hall meeting around Ohio. The intended audience includes: legislators, employers, civic and non-profit groups, local community organizations etc... who have a desire to support our military Families. The goal is to ensure that the general public in Ohio knows were to go if they know of a military Family member who needs assistance OR if they or their organization wants to contribute and assist our military Families. Simply – it is outreach to our communities to enable them to assist you all in meaningful ways.

Finally, if you have questions about your family program or family readiness group... make a call. Contact your unit or contact one of our team members: our FACs, Wing Family Program Coordinators, Volunteer Council members etc. We are here to serve.

<u>Joint Family Support Assistance Program –</u> <u>JFSAP</u>

Ohio serves as one of 15 states participating in the JFSAP three year pilot program. JFSAP; purpose is to create a united community to connect military families with each other and with supportive resources. The JFSAP team will partner with and augment activities of Family Assistance Centers, Guard and Reserve programs including Inter-Service Family Assistance Committees (ISFACs), unit Family Readiness Group Leaders, and other programs and services to build coalitions to connect Federal, state, county and local resources to support Active Duty, Guard and Reserve Service Members and their Families.

The Ohio JFSAP team includes a Military OneSource Consultant, Military and Family Life Consultant, Child and Youth Consultant, Transition Assistance Advisor, Operation Military Kids, and Red Cross representatives. JFSAP Team Members Include: **Drew Henderson** – <u>Military Family Life Consultant</u> Travels throughout the state to provide solution-focused counseling services to individuals, couples, and families for situations resulting from commonly occurring life circumstances. The focus is on hope—identifying problems and then restoring balance to life. Also provides educational programs addressing life skills and military lifestyle topics.

HB 372 – Signed into law Effective March 20, 2008

- Exempts estates of armed forces members who died while serving in a combat zone from probate fees
- Exempts military retirement pay from the income tax
- Provides that reservists and National Guard members may renew their professional licenses within six months after active duty service
- Extends continuing education reporting periods for National Guard members ordered to duty by the Governor
- Provides that standard "Purple Heart" license plates be issued without charge.
- Designates Interstate Routes 70 and 71 as the "Purple Heart Trail"
- Authorizes the display of combat battle stars on certain special combat or military license plates (No later than June 20, 2008)

- Prohibits discrimination under the Ohio Civil Rights Commission Law and certain other laws on the basis of military status
- Requires the Attorney General to appoint a staff member of the Consumer Protection Division to expedite certain cases or issues raised by a person, or the person's immediate family, who is deployed on active duty
- Grants certain military persons additional civil service
- Requires relevant military experience to be considered in continuing education determinations

Tax Season!!! ... And the Good News Is...

Military OneSource

Beginning January 14, 2008, Military OneSource will once again provide free tax preparation services to military service members and their families during this tax season!

- □ Military OneSource is offering free tax preparation services through the H&R Block TaxCut program.
- Those eligible for the program are active duty, Guard and Reserve (regardless of activation status), spouses and dependent children (authorized in DEERS), family members handling the affairs of a deployed service member, and severely injured service members or family members handling their affairs.

Operation CPA

The Ohio Society of CPAs is once again sponsoring Operation CPA in partnership with the Ohio National Guard and Ohio's Inter-Service Family Assistance Committee. CPAs from throughout Ohio have volunteered their time and expertise to prepare 2007 tax returns free of charge for deployed Ohio residents this filing season.

- Military personnel who are Ohio residents currently deployed outside of the state will qualify for free preparation of their 2007 individual or joint local, state and federal personal tax returns.

Our Military Kids Grant Program

Our Military Kids is a Grant Program that has been a huge success in Ohio. They have provided over \$50,000 to Ohio's Military kids to help them stay involved in extracurricular activities during their loved ones deployment. With the recent Brigade deployment now is the time to contact them to apply for your grant.

If the answer is YES to any of the following questions, **Our Military Kids** grant program may be able to help.

- Are you or your spouse deploying or deployed overseas?
- Do you have school-aged children who play sports?
- Or do they take dance, music or arts classes?
- Maybe they would they like to try something new... like Karate?
- Could your child benefit from a tutor to stay at their grade level?

Our Military Kids grant pays the fees (**one activity per child up to \$500**) for children in grades K–12 of deployed Reserve and National Guard to participate in youth sports, fine arts, and tutor programs. This is a way of recognizing the sacrifices the entire family is making while the service member is deployed overseas. **Please keep in mind the one activity limit so you may want to be selective about which activity you choose in order to get the most out of the grant.**
