Ohio National Guard support to Louisiana in response to hurricane Gustav

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The Ohio National Guard has deployed about 1100 Soldiers and airmen to assist in the Hurricane Gustav recovery efforts. Two of the largest units deployed are the 216th Eng. Battalion and the 112th Transportation Battalion. These units began their missions today assisting the state of Louisiana.

The engineer units are deployed to the Baton Rouge area and the transportation units are operating throughout southeastern Louisiana. Their missions include clearing debris and opening transportation lanes, moving people and supplies and maintaining military equipment.

Major General Greg Wayt, the adjutant general of Ohio, said, "The situation on the ground in Louisiana is serious, but the National Guard is a critical component of a serious response. The Soldiers and airmen of the Ohio National Guard are well trained and well led [and stand ready to heed the call should any other contingency arise](#). The majority of the Ohio National Guard is still available should they be needed."

As for how long the Ohio Guardsmen will be away from home, Wayt said, "We don't expect that this mission will extend longer than two or three weeks for any of the Ohio soldiers and airmen currently deployed."

The assistance is being provided under the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), a national mutual aid and partnership agreement that allows state-to-state assistance during states of emergencies declared by the Governor or President. The agreement provides a responsive and straightforward system to for the National Guard in unaffected states to send personnel and equipment to help disaster relief efforts in affected states.

NOTE: In the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina in 2005, the Ohio National Guard provided nearly 1,500 Soldiers and Airmen for response and recovery efforts in Louisiana and Mississippi, followed less than a month later by the deployment of another 1,200 Soldiers and Airmen to Louisiana in response to Hurricane Rita.
