1. <i>Review of APEC Minutes & Metrics</i>	<i>Presentation</i>	<i>Ongoing</i>
The minutes of the last APEC were reviewed and approved. The minutes will be posted to the website. Issue 179-07-08, Manning Document Review, will be changed to complete at the request of the co-chairs. Training metrics were reviewed.		
2. <i>Energy Conservation</i>	<i>Discussion</i>	<i>Ongoing</i>
As a state we are currently 5% under our goal which will serve as a buffer over the next few months. We are projected to end the year 6% below our goal if we stay on track. Mission changes and projects at the buildings themselves have a significant impact on our energy consumption. Members were confused on parts of the metrics. Mr. Gooch will communicate with LtCol Gieze at Toledo to see the tools he uses to track energy consumption.		
3. <i>Overdue Technician Appraisals</i>	<i>Discussion</i>	<i>Ongoing</i>
There were no overdue appraisals.		
4. <i>178th Reduction in Force</i>	<i>Update</i>	<i>Ongoing</i>
The council members received an update brief on the RIF at Springfield. The majority of the impacted employees are in Ops, MXS and LRS. The Dutch FMS mission is extended until January 2011 which will provide some relief. The centralized board will meet 14-18 June to begin placement actions at the 178 th and across the state. 2012 is the target year for funding of new missions. Template exist for NASIC and RPA units but won't be immediately available as they are currently in flux. There are concerns that employees may not qualify for positions in the future mission due to fitness standards required for schools, ASVAB scores, color vision and security clearances. Employees must meet these requirements before attending requisite AFSC producing schools.		
5. <i>CBA Renegotiations</i>	<i>Discussion</i>	<i>Ongoing</i>
The council discussed the upcoming negotiations. Labor and management members were identified and the group discussed possible negotiation topics such as telework. Employees with suggested negotiation topics should forward those items to labor and management representatives for forwarding to the negotiation teams for consideration.

Reminder to LPC's:

LPCs will meet quarterly at a minimum and more frequently as needed. Quarterly LPC meetings are expected to take place the first month of the new quarter. Service PECs are scheduled to meet during the second month of the quarter at a minimum. The Executive PEC is scheduled to meet in the last month of the quarter at a minimum. Minutes will be verified and forwarded to Labor Relations within fourteen (14) calendar days. Minutes are to address, at a minimum; the attendees; the substance of topics discussed, arranged as Old Business and New Business; and a status, whether that be resolved, tabled or forwarded for consideration at the Service PEC.
