| <p><i>1. Previous Minutes & LPC Metrics</i> The minutes were reviewed and accepted. The metrics were reviewed. All LPCs are meeting timely with quorum. Open and recently closed issues were discussed. Item West-07-09 brought up a discussion of whether AO representation should be included in the East and West LPCs so armory techs would be represented. No decision was made. CSMS-07-07 (Safety and PPE) was discussed and all agreed that coveralls and a cleaning service were a good option. COL Tack is working on it. ARPEC items 07-05 (FMS Modernization) and 07-06 (AASF1 Upgrade) were closed, but could be raised again if updates were warranted. It was emphasized that a key component of all Safety issues remains communication on Composite Risk Management, specifics, interim mitigation, and resolution.</p> | <i>Ongoing</i> |
| <p><i>2. Eaton Shop Brief</i> After labor-management coordination, FMS 14a is slated to close effective 19 Nov 2007. The two current employees accepted reassignment to Piqua. Piqua is slated to close in 2012 and relocate to the new Joint FMS at Springfield ANG Base. An employee briefing and Q&A will be held 14 Nov 2007.</p> | <i>Closed</i> |
| <p><i>3. Energy Conservation</i> The Governor has mandated that agencies will achieve a 5% reduction in energy usage from a baseline of last winter. The CoS has issued communication to management to that effect. The CoS has requested usage metrics by facility to identify areas of further reduction. Help from LPCs is necessary to identify energy reduction opportunities, work through associated issues and support new initiatives.</p> | <i>Closed</i> |
| <p><i>4. Technician Appraisal Cycle</i> All LPCs responded that they do not support changing the performance appraisal cycle to October. The ARPEC endorses this recommendation and will forward the detailed LPC responses to the JPEC for the 20 Dec 2007 meeting.</p> | <i>Closed</i> |
| <p><i>5. Transformation</i> CSMS: No date of opening has been set. Contractor delays and coordination with DSCC continue to delay the opening.</p> | <i>Ongoing</i> |
