Status

1. Previous Minutes & LPC Metrics

Ongoing

The minutes were reviewed and accepted. The metrics were reviewed. All LPC's are meeting timely with quorum. Some issues raised at the LPCs were not forwarded to the Army PEC as intended. Those issues will be captured and forwarded after this meeting. All facilitator positions are filled and trained. The recommendation was made that we stay ahead of the curve for this training requirement. Directorates and units are highly encouraged to submit names to attend the Hiring Training events on 15 April and 15 July. Units are up to date on IBB training. AASF#2 is sending LPC members to upcoming IBB training events.

2. Overdue Appraisals

Ongoing

There are no overdue appraisals to report.

3. Energy Conservation

Standing Item

Mr. Gooch gave a presentation on Energy Conservation. The Adjutant General's Department, Army National Guard, is 4% below the Governor's goal. We are succeeding due to modernization of lighting, temperature controls, thermal equalizers and keeping large doors closed. Further reductions will come through utilization of alternative energy sources and newer, more efficient facilities.

4. Safety Issue Update

Standing Item

The majority of the safety issues presented since the last meeting were properly mitigated and have action plans in place for permanent resolution. The Facilities Maintenance Sub-working Group identified deficiencies in ventilation systems. Those systems appear to not meet the air quality standards required for the work load and location. The ATAG and DIMR are engaged in finding a way to hold the contractor who installed and tested the ventilators accountable for the systems' poor performance.

5. *Facilities Construction*

Update

COL Ore estimated that Mansfield Readiness Center and FMS would cost 18.5 million. They are both to be completed by the end of 2010. CSMS Phase II will begin this year. There was a slight delay due to a bidding dispute. Phase II will cost 24 million. This will add 24 additional bays, some which can be drive through bays. This project should be complete by 15 September 2011. The Springfield Readiness Center and FMS would cost 18.5 million. They are both to be completed by 15 September 2010.

6. *Surface Maintenance Transformation*

Update

LTC Wirth briefed his plan on how to provide employees with Facility update information as it pertains to them for PCS moves. Management, the union and HRO scheduled briefings for all affected employees to take place later this month. This topic is to be an added agenda item at the next meeting.
