## WEEK IN REVIEW

**M**

JULY 15, 1876: The 1486th Transportation Company is organized in Ashland as Company F, 12th Infantry Regiment (Ashland Guards).

JULY 15, 1911: Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 437th Military Police Battalion and the 323d Military Police Company are organized in Toledo as Troop D, 1st Cavalry Squadron.

JULY 15, 1917: The Ohio National Guard is called into federal service for World War I.

JULY 15, 1918: The 166th Infantry, as part of the French army, stops a German attack near the French village of Suippes in the Champagne Region.

**W**

JULY 17, 1884: The 5694th Engineer Detachment is organized in Plimpton as Company H, 17th Infantry Regiment (Plimpton Guard).

**Th**

JULY 18, 1877: Battery C, 1st Battalion, 134th Field Artillery Regiment is organized in Marysville as Company E, 14th Infantry Regiment (Curry Cadets).

JULY 18, 1881: The 237th Support Battalion is organized in the Ohio National Guard from existing units as the 9th Battalion of Infantry.

JULY 18, 1917: Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team is constituted in the Ohio National Guard as Headquarters, 37th Division.

JULY 18, 2007: The 295th and 296th Engineer Detachments are organized in Mansfield.

JULY 18, 2014: The 178th Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Group and the 125th, 126th and 127th Intelligence Squadrons are constituted in the Ohio Air National Guard at Springfield.

**F**

JULY 19, 1863: Confederate Gen. John H. Morgan's Raiders are defeated near Portland, Ohio at Buffington Island by federal troops and Ohio Militia.

JULY 19, 1877: Company B, 1st Battalion, 148th Infantry Regiment is organized in Napoleon as Company F, 16th Infantry Regiment (Napoleon Light Guard).

**Su**

JULY 21, 1861: The Battle of Bull Run takes place, marking the first major battle of the Civil War. The 1st and 2d Ohio Volunteer Infantry provided rear guard actions as the Union Army retreated toward Washington following the battle.
