



The struggle for civil rights in the LGBT community actually began much earlier. **Dr. Frank E. Kameny** fought for gay rights more than a decade before the Stonewall riots. He served






in World War II, and later as a civil service astronomer with the U.S. Army Map Service. According to the Library of Congress, Kameny was fired and banned from federal employment in 1957 because he was gay. 
Technical Sergeant Leonard P. Matlovich was a Vietnam War veteran, voluntarily serving three combat tours, and later as a military race relations instructor. He earned the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star. He was also the first gay service

member to purposely out himself, to challenge the ban on homosexuals in the military. Matlovich wrote a letter to his commanding officer, revealing his homosexuality and asking for an exception to be made because of his service record. The officer looked at it and said: "Just tear it up and we will forget it." He refused. 


