1. References. Executive Order (EO) 13693, *Planning for Federal Sustainability in the Next Decade*, dated 19 March 2015. ISO 14001:2004(E), *Environmental Management Systems – Requirements with Guidance for Use*, dated 15 November 2004.

2. The OHARNG is a dynamic organization comprised of men and women dedicated to fulfilling our federal, state, and community missions. Readiness of our units and our Soldiers is integral to each of these missions, and resources that provide and facilitate readiness are a top priority. c. Complying with all relevant environmental legislation and regulations.

d. Executing a formalized educational process that ensures Soldiers are informed of environmental program requirements and are able to execute individual and organizational responsibilities.

e. Continually improving upon pollution prevention and reduction strategies through the application of innovative processes and technologies.

f. Considering the environmental requirements and impacts in all planning processes relative to training, equipment fielding, and construction.
