FIJI CEREMONIAL WHALE'S TOOTH

Presented to Maj. Gen. Robert S. Beightler during a meke ceremony while the 37th Infantry Division was stationed on Fiji. The meke is given in honor of a distinguished visitor and corresponds roughly to the custom of an American mayor presenting a distinguished guest with a key to the city. The ceremony starts with a series of native dances and rhythmical chanting. A kava ritual is performed, which generates a drink that is offered to each guest in a coconut bowl. The meke is often climaxed by the presentation of a whale's tooth, a symbol of brotherhood.
