GUIDON, COMPANY A, 1ST BATTALION, 147TH INFANTRY

This guidon was used by Company A during the 1980s. A guidon is a swallow-tailed unit marker that measures 20-inches on the hoist by 27-inches on the fly. Centered on the national flag blue guidon is a white crossed rifles, the branch insignia of the infantry, with the regimental number "147" above, the battalion number "1" to the left, and the company letter "A" below the insignia. The current Battery A, 1st Battalion, 174th Air Defense Artillery Regiment was designated as Company A from 1963 to 1992.
