



WEEK IN REVIEW



MAY 27, 1864: Brig. Gen. Thomas Wood's 3d Division, IV Corps conducts the main assault against the Confederate right flank at the Battle of Pickett's Mill, Ga. Ohio regiments made up 10 of the 22 regiments in Wood's three brigades.

MAY 27, 1953: The emblem for the 121st Air Refueling Wing is approved for the 121st Fighter-Bomber Wing.



MAY 29, 1945: The 37th Infantry Division begins the Cagayan Valley Campaign on Luzon, Philippine Islands.



JUNE 1, 1944: The 122d Army Band is organized on Bougainville as the 37th Infantry Division Band.

JUNE 1, 1973: The 121st, 178th and 180th Security Forces Squadrons are federally recognized as the 121st, 178th and 180th Weapons System Security Flights.

121ST TACTICAL FIGHTER WING EMBLEM

This emblem was worn by Airmen of the 121st Tactical Fighter Wing in the 1980s on the Battle Dress Uniform (BDU). This patch is the subdued version of the full color emblem which consists of a maroon, teal and olive drab color palette. The nebuly division of the emblem is emblematic of the sky and the Air Force mission. The cubit arm, brandishing a sword, is for military protection of the sky above. The winged chaplet is for fidelity and loyalty toward successfully accomplishing the Air Force program. The unit designation in the scroll was changed to 121st Air Refueling Wing in 1993, when the unit was redesignated.
