Ohio National Guard to break ground on new supply warehouse

ZANESVILLE, Ohio—The Ohio National Guard will conduct an official groundbreaking ceremony at 9 a.m. Monday, Oct. 25, 2010, for a new supply warehouse at the 220th Engineering Installation Squadron, 4995 Old Wheeling Road, Zanesville, Ohio, 43701.

The 4,900-square-foot addition will allow the 220th to store required mobility equipment and supplies. It will also contain a 400-square-foot area that will be used for Air Force physical fitness training and testing. Rep. Zach Space from Ohio's 18th Congressional District was instrumental in securing funding for the warehouse and will be joining Maj. Gen. Gregory L. Wayt, adjutant general, for the event.

The 220th provides engineering and installation support to all military components. They are one of only 16 Air National Guard units in the nation with this mission. The new facility will eliminate the costs of maintenance and repairs required by the older buildings. In addition, it will free up an additional 3,000 square feet in existing structures that that will be converted to storage. The facility design includes a solar array to help meet green federal design standards, and will achieve Leadership Energy and Environmental Design silver certification once complete.

The supply warehouse designer is Ryan Renken, from Jacobs Global Buildings North America. The general contractor is Dan Henderson from Henderson Contracting Corp.
