# CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER 5, JAY K. STUCKMAN State Command Chief Warrant Officer - Ohio Army National Guard



Chief Warrant Officer 5 Jay Stuckman enlisted in the Ohio Army National Guard in March 1985. After completing basic combat training at Fort Knox, Ky. in August 1985, Stuckman graduated from Colonel Crawford High School in June 1986. Upon completion of advanced individual training at Fort Gordon, Ga. September 1986, he was assigned as a combat signaler, to Battery B, 1-136 Field Artillery, Ohio Army National Guard. In June 1987 Stuckman accepted a full-time position as a recruiter's aide, followed by assignment to Personnel Service Branch in 1988. Stuckman's next assignment was personnel records clerk with 4<sup>th</sup> Squadron, 107<sup>th</sup> Armored Cavalry Regiment in October 1989.

Appointed Warrant Officer, November 1993, Stuckman attended Initial Entry Rotary Wing Flight Training, and

Aviation Warrant Officer Basic Course in 1993. Following graduation he was assigned to Detachment 1, Company N, 4/107<sup>th</sup> Armored Cavalry Regiment and served as a UH-1 Iroquois Pilot. In 1996 Stuckman transferred to Company A, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 137<sup>th</sup> Assault Helicopter Battalion. Stuckman was selected as the full-time unit training officer for Co B 1-137<sup>th</sup> Aviation Regiment in 1999, where he served until his appointment to State Command Chief Warrant Officer for the Ohio Army National Guard.

In January 2009, CW5 Stuckman deployed to Iraq with 1-137<sup>th</sup> Aviation Regiment, and flew 136 combat missions logging over 564 combat flight hours in the UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter.

As the State Command Chief Warrant Officer (CCWO) CW5 Stuckman serves as the senior ranking warrant officer of the JFHQ Command Group and works for the Assistant Adjutant General for the Ohio Army National Guard (OHARNG). He manages the military aspects of all full time and traditional OHARNG warrant officers to include readines, recruiting, retention, selection, assignment, training, education, performance, care, conduct, apearance, effective personnel utilization, management, equal opportunity, awards and recognition.

CW5 Stuckman serves on many committees and represents OHARNG warrant officers at the state, regional and national level. The CCWO is the primary representative and spokesperson for all warrant officers and is the primary advisor to Assistant Adjutant General concerning all warrant officer affairs.

He is a member of the following professional organizations: Ohio National Guard Association, National Guard Association United States, United States Army Warrant Officer Association, and Army Aviation Association of America.
