- 1916** Mustered into Federal service 6 July 1916 at Camp Willis, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 28 February 1917 at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana
- 1917** Redesignated 16 April 1917 as Troop C, 1st Cavalry Regiment²
- Converted and redesignated 22 May 1917 as Battery D, 3d Field Artillery³
- Called into Federal service 15 July 1917; Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917⁴
- Reorganized and redesignated 15 September 1917 as Battery D, 136th Field Artillery, an element of the 37th Division⁵
- 1919** Demobilized 10 April 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio⁶
- 1920** Reorganized and Federally recognized 27 January 1920 in the Ohio National Guard at Cincinnati as Troop C, 1st Cavalry⁷
- 1921** Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1921 as Troop C, 107th Cavalry, an element of the 22d Cavalry Division⁸
- 1929** Redesignated 30 June 1929 as Troop I, 107th Cavalry⁹
- 1940** Redesignated 1 November 1940 as Troop B, 107th Cavalry and relieved from assignment to the 22d Cavalry Division¹⁰

- 1940** Disbanded 1 November 1940²⁶
- 1947** Reorganized and Federally recognized 19 May 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Cincinnati as Battery A, 134th Field Artillery Battalion, an element of the 37th Infantry Division²⁷
- 1952** Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Cincinnati²⁸
- 1954** (Battery A, 134th Field Artillery Battalion [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 15 January 1954)²⁹
- Released from active Federal service 15 June 1954 and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Battery A, 134th Field Artillery Battalion (NGUS)³⁰
- 1959** Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1959 as Battery A, 2d Howitzer Battalion, 134th Artillery³¹

- 1940** Reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1940 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 1st Squadron, 107th Cavalry and relieved from assignment to the 22d Cavalry Division³⁴
- 1941** Inducted into Federal service 5 March 1941 at Cincinnati³⁵
- 1944** Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1944 as Headquarters, Headquarters and Service Troop, 22d Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron³⁶
- Inactivated 15 August 1944 at Camp Gruber, Oklahoma³⁷
- 1947** Reorganized and Federally recognized 23 January 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Cincinnati as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 134th Field Artillery Battalion, an element of the 37th Infantry Division³⁸
- 1952** Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Cincinnati³⁹
- 1954** (Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 134th Field Artillery Battalion [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 15 January 1954)⁴⁰

- 1942** Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1942 as Service Battery, 134th Field Artillery Battalion, an element of the 37th Infantry Division⁴⁹
- 1945** Inactivated 13 October 1945 at Ft. Bragg, North Carolina⁵⁰
- 1947** Reorganized and Federally recognized 27 August 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Cincinnati as Service Battery, 134th Field Artillery Battalion⁵¹
- 1952** Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Cincinnati⁵²
- 1954** (Service Battery, 134th Field Artillery Battalion [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 15 January 1954)⁵³
- Released from active Federal service 15 June 1954 and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Service Battery, 134th Field Artillery Battalion (NGUS)⁵⁴
