### DEFINITIONS

#### MILITARY CONSTRUCTION (MILCON)

The National Defense Authorization Act authorizes military construction and provides Federal appropriations for construction of OHNG facilities. Typically, there is a state matching fund based on a percentage of the overall allocation.

#### SUSTAINMENT, RESTORATION AND MODERNIZATION (SRM)

SRM differs from military construction as it is focused on improving/upgrading existing facilities.

#### REAL PROPERTY OPERATIONS/MAINTENANCE

Routine upkeep and maintenance of facilities and equipment (air handling/heating/cooling). There are federal and state funding streams for operations and maintenance with varying levels of federal to state matching appropriations.



# ADJUTANT GENERAL'S DEPT./OHIO NATIONAL GUARD

## ORGANIZATION

The Adjutant General is responsible for oversight and administration of the organized militia of the state of Ohio. The Adjutant General of Ohio serves simultaneously as the commander of the organized militia and the Ohio National Guard; the senior military advisor to the governor; and a member of the governor's cabinet.

The organized militia consists of the Ohio Army National Guard, Ohio Air National Guard, and State Defense Force. As a principal state agency, the Adjutant General's Department is responsible to the governor for directing all aspects of training, recruiting, policy, budget, and resource management for the Ohio National Guard and State Defense Force; for ensuring that the Ohio National Guard achieves administrative, training, and readiness requirements established by the Department of Defense, National Guard Bureau, and Active Components of the United States Army and United States Air Force. The Adjutant General's Department ensures that individuals and units are ready to respond to the needs of the state and the nation by assessing the future, positioning to counter threats, and ensuring the organization is prepared, ready, and postured to act.

The Ohio Army National Guard/Ohio Air National Guard provide a trained and ready operational reserve poised to support National Defense Strategy and the needs of combatant commands worldwide while remaining responsive to the directives of the president and the needs of the nation. The Ohio Army National Guard/Ohio Air National Guard receive federal funding from DoD and the United States Army and Air Force through National Guard Bureau. These appropriations encompass funding for operations, constructing facilities, renovating facilities, sustaining existing facilities, acquiring and maintaining equipment, and compensating (pay/benefits) uniformed members of the Ohio National Guard and federal employees.

The Ohio National Guard and State Defense Force provide the governor and citizens of Ohio with unique capacities and capabilities able to respond and effect a broad spectrum of unfamiliar environments created by civil unrest, pandemics, natural disasters, narco-criminal activities, domestic extremism, and the risks incurred within the cyber domain. The governor, as the commander in chief of the Ohio National Guard, mobilizes the Ohio National Guard and State Defense Force under State Active Duty orders when the capabilities of local or state agencies are overwhelmed or require augmentation/support.

# ADJUTANT GENERAL'S DEPT./OHIO NATIONAL GUARD

## ORIGIN OF TODAY'S NATIONAL GUARD

The Militia Act of 1903 created the modern National Guard system. Known as the "Dick Act," named for the legislative sponsor, Senator Charles Dick, a Major General in the Ohio National Guard. The act gave increased federal funding and allocated equipment to the National Guard. In return guard units were required to adopt regular army standards and become subject to inspection by regular army officers. It transformed the militia from individual state forces into a Reserve Component of the Army, the Air Force in 1947.

In addition to the United States Constitution, the Dick Act and the National Defense Act of 1916 became the most important legislative items in the history of the guard. Senator Dick's vision for a National Guard became reality in 1916 when the Ohio National Guard was mobilized for service along the Mexican Border. Over 7,000 Ohio National Guard Soldiers mustered at Camp Willis, near Upper Arlington, in June and began to arrive in Texas by late August.

The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard serves the Citizens of Ohio and the nation by fulfilling the state and Federal military role of providing public safety when directed by the Governor, or supporting National Defense Strategy, when directed by the President. Our commitment is "**Always Ready, Always There.**"

## OBLIGATIONS

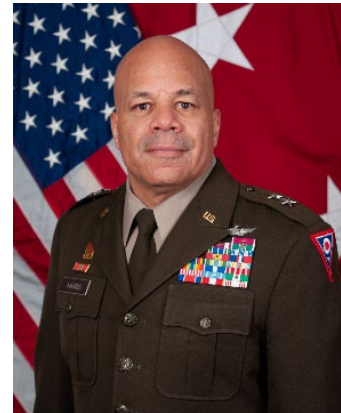
- Provide ready individuals and forces to defend the state and the homeland.
- Provide ready individuals and forces to support the National Defense Strategy and US interests worldwide.
- Provide the state of Ohio with unique capabilities and capacities.
- Represent the military throughout the state, allow Ohioans to serve the communities where they live and work.
- Attract and retain talent in Ohio. Provide education, training, experiences, and opportunities to all Ohioans eligible for military service.
- Promote civil-military cooperation and interoperability; collaborate with local, state, and federal partners across a broad category of initiatives and programs beyond public safety.
- Support US partnerships abroad - encourage and reinforce democracy and collective defense through the State Partnership Program (SPP).

# ADJUTANT GENERAL'S DEPT./OHIO NATIONAL GUARD

## ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

### THE ADJUTANT GENERAL

The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard is a unique military enterprise that serves the needs of the state and nation in addition to multiple community, state, and federal stakeholders. As the Adjutant General of Ohio, Major General John C. Harris Jr. is responsible to the Governor of the State of Ohio and the President of the United States. These two responsibilities involve preparing for and responding to current and emerging homeland security threats, homeland defense initiatives, and national defense roles and missions.



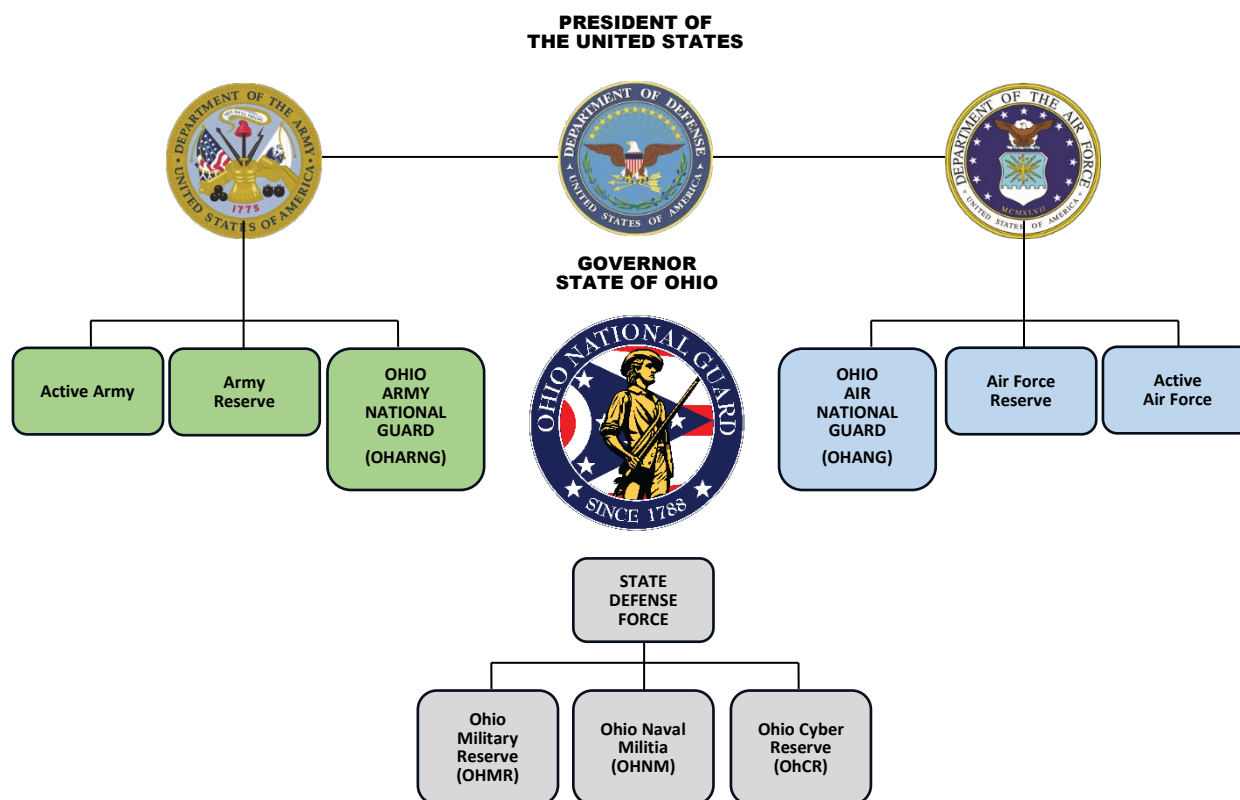

### KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- The Adjutant General of Ohio and the Assistant Adjutant Generals for Army and Air are state employees serving in a federal recognized status.
- The commander of the State Defense Force is not federally recognized but receives a commission and recognition as a General Officer by the Governor of Ohio.
- The majority of individuals serving in the Ohio National Guard are “traditional” National Guard members - Citizen Soldiers and Airmen - not serving full-time.
- The Ohio National Guard retains a full-time staff of Active Guard Reserve members, (Federal) Dual - Status (Federal) Technicians, or Title 32 (uniformed military), and Title 5 (Federal) Technicians (non-uniformed civilians).
- Collectively, Active Guard Reserve, Dual-Status Technicians, and Title 5 Technicians are referred to as Full-Time Unit Staff.
- The Adjutant General's Department has authorized state employees that manage state funds and appropriations, operations, and maintain organization facilities and programs.
- The State Defense Force does not utilize Full-Time Unit Staff. State Defense Force members are activated under State Active Duty, when authorized by the Governor. This allows State Defense Force members to serve as temporary employees of the state of Ohio (identified as a “1099” independent contractor).
- Traditional Ohio National Guard members placed on State Active Duty also serve as temporary employees of the state of Ohio (identified as a “1099” independent contractor).

# COMPONENTS

## ADJUTANT GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT/THE OHIO NATIONAL GUARD



### FACTS

- **The Ohio National Guard is responsible to the Governor and the President.**  
As a state military force, it is recognized as part of the organized state militia in the Ohio Constitution/Ohio Revised Code (ORC 5923).
- **The Ohio National Guard has two Federally recognized Reserve Components:**
  - Ohio Army National Guard and Ohio Air National Guard.
  - The State Defense Force, as part of the organized state militia, is recognized by Ohio.
- **An Army and Air National Guard exists in each of the 54 states and territories.**
  - Ohio has the second largest Air National Guard and consistently a top five (largest) Army National Guard.
  - The Ohio National Guard is the single largest uniformed service in Ohio.
- **The Adjutant General of Ohio fulfills three roles:**
  1. Primary cabinet member and senior military advisor to the Governor of Ohio
  2. Commander of the Ohio National Guard
  3. Adjutant General (Commander) of the State Defense Force
    - Ohio Military Reserve
    - Ohio Naval Militia
    - Ohio Cyber Reserve
- **The remaining Reserve Components:**  
**US Army Reserve, US Air Force Reserve, US Navy Reserve, and US Marine Corps Reserve** are not part of the National Guard. These components report directly to their Federal components and are limited by law in how they support individual states.

# COMPONENTS

## OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD (OHARNG)



The Ohio Army National Guard provides similar capabilities as the US Army. As a land component, the Army/Ohio Army National Guard provides Maneuver, Fires, and Effects (artillery, infantry, armor, air defense artillery, engineers, aviation, military police, chemical corps), Operations Support (military intelligence, signal corps), Force Sustainment (adjutant general (personnel and administration), finance, ordinance corps, transportation (quartermaster), Health Services (Medical Services, Nurse Corps), and Special Forces across the range of combat and non-combat environments to include homeland defense and homeland security. Additionally, the Ohio Army National has roles and capabilities tied directly to domestic operations through the Homeland Defense Force and Cyber Force (Cyber Protection Team). The OHARNG has a wide range of capabilities able to respond to national defense missions or domestic operations.

# COMPONENTS

## OHIO AIR NATIONAL GUARD (OHANG)



The Ohio Air National Guard provides similar capabilities as the United States Air Force. As the nation’s primary air component, the United States Air Force provides broad capabilities relevant to air and space. The Ohio Air National Guard is the one of the largest in the nation and has specific capabilities relevant to air superiority (180th Fighter Wing), Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (178th Wing), global mobility, airlift and air refueling (121st Air Refueling Wing), and cyber (179 Cyberspace Wing). Additionally, the Ohio Air National Guard provides capabilities and personnel to the Homeland Response Force and supports space missions (under United States Space Force). # COMPONENTS

## STATE DEFENSE FORCE (SDF)



The State Defense Force is comprised of the Ohio Military Reserve (OHMR), Ohio Naval Militia (OHNM), and Ohio Cyber Reserve (OhCR). As an integral part of the ADJ, these organizations have specific roles that enhance the capabilities of the OHNG and provide additional civil-military expertise and functionality to the state of Ohio. The State Defense Force has a primary focus to protect and serve the state. The State Defense Force shares similarities with the OHARNG (OHMR) and US Navy (OHNM) in rank and organization, but are not part of the Reserve Component nor affiliated with the Active Component.

### STATE DEFENSE FORCE FACTS

- The State Defense Force is part of the organized state militia, not part of the RC or Federally funded National Guard.
- The State Defense Force/Ohio Military Reserve was established in 1949.
- The State Defense Force is commanded by a Brigadier General who reports directly to the Adjutant General of Ohio.
- The State Defense Force has 350-400 total personnel (no formal/limited authorization).
- The State Defense Force utilizes Ohio National Guard facilities, and as needed, Ohio National Guard equipment.
- The Ohio Cyber Reserve is one of only a few cyber capable organizations established by a state.
- The Ohio Military Reserve has drone/remote pilot vehicle capabilities.
- The State Defense Force was a significant part of the state of Ohio's COVID-19 response supporting distribution missions (food and vaccinations, medical supplies) in addition to augmenting the Ohio Department of Corrections and Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services Historical/chronological list of State Active Duty/other activities.

STATE DEFENSE FORCE

## STATE DEFENSE FORCE (SDF)

The State Defense Force is comprised of the Ohio Military Reserve, Ohio Naval Militia, and Ohio Cyber Reserve. As an integral part of the ADJ, these organizations have specific roles that enhance the capabilities of the OHNG and provide additional civil-military expertise and functionality to the state of Ohio. The State Defense Force has a primary focus to protect and serve the state. The State Defense Force shares similarities with the OHARNG (OHMR) and US Navy (OHNM) in rank and organization, but are not part of the Reserve Component nor affiliated with the Active Component.



## OHIO MILITARY RESERVE (OHMR)

The OHMR is focused on providing capabilities related to Emergency Support Functions 6 (Mass Care) and 7 (Logistics and Resource Management) under the Federal Emergency Management (FEMA) Incident Command (IC) structure. Organized similar to a US Army/OHARNG brigade, the OHMR has the requisite training, administrative, operational, and sustainment capacity to respond to state level emergencies.

The OHMR is not compensated for their training - they are compensated during activations under State Active Duty according to their rank (identical to those of the Army/OHARNG).



## OHIO NAVAL MILITIA (OHNM)

The OHNM provides safety and site security support to the ranges at Camp Perry Joint Training Center with the ability to provide small boat capabilities to the state of Ohio for emergency events under SAD. The OHNM is not compensated for their training - they are compensated during SAD activation according to their rank (identical to those of the US Navy).



## OHIO CYBER RESERVE (OHCR)

The OhCR is a recent addition to the State Defense Force (2020) and is comprised entirely of cyber professionals from academia and private/public enterprise. The impetus for the OhCR was to expand ADJ/State Defense Force capabilities in cyber preparedness/defense by involving civilian experts in the field of information technology/cyber, organizing them within the ADJ. The OhCR is not compensated for their training — they are compensated during SAD activation or during specific training events.

The OhCR is one of only a few cyber preparedness and response elements, nationwide, established at the state level under an organized militia.



# PROPERTY

The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard manages and operates buildings, properties, and facilities throughout Ohio that are state owned and/or federally licensed to the state of Ohio. Funding for constructions, renovation, and maintenance of these sites and buildings are based on a combination of state and federal appropriations gained through legislation (Ohio General Revenue Fund, Defense Authorization Act).

# STATUS OF FORCES & INDIVIDUALS

## STATUS OF FORCES

The Ohio National Guard has the ability to respond to the Governor under two of three distinct status categories. First, Title 32 United States Code, a federal status, and State Active Duty (state funded). Title 10 USC is only authorized by the President. There are situations in which the Ohio National Guard can respond in multiple status authorization - typically Title 32 and State Active Duty - depending on the situation and units/capabilities requested.

**TITLE 10 STATUS (T10)** is active duty, placing a member of the Ohio Army National Guard/ Ohio Air National Guard under federal control. This occurs when an Ohio National Guard unit or individual is ordered to mobilize and deploy in response/support of National Defense Strategy. Additionally, individuals assigned to the Ohio National Guard are placed on Title 10 during periods of active duty/federal training or to support specific missions and programs. Only the Ohio Army National Guard/Ohio Air National Guard, with direct connections to their federal components (US Army/IUS Air Force) are placed on Title 10.

**TITLE 32 STATUS (T32)** is active-duty, placing a member of the Ohio Army National Guard/ Ohio Air National Guard under federal control. This occurs when an Ohio National Guard unit or individual is activated in response to a significant disaster/emergency or homeland defense/ homeland security event. This status provides federal funding to the Ohio National Guard, but with command authority retained by the Governor and the Adjutant General of Ohio. The Title 32 authorization is contingent upon a federal disaster declaration and consent from the Secretary of Defense. Additionally, Title 32 status is used during unit/individual training periods for Ohio National Guard individuals. The State Defense Force is not eligible for Title 32.

**STATE ACTIVE DUTY (SAD)** is the status in which the Ohio National Guard /State Defense Force typically responds to state emergencies. During State Active Duty, the Governor applies state funds to activate (pay/resource) Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force members without requiring federal authority/funding. In some instances, SAD costs are split/shared by the federal government if a national or local federal disaster proclamation is made, or specific requirements are achieved. The State Active Duty status allows the Governor/Adjutant General of Ohio broad authority to respond to emergencies, but has limitations for Ohio National Guard members (entitlements and other benefits derived from Federal service).

## FACTS

- The Ohio National Guard has mobilized for emergencies in both Title 32 and State Active Duty status simultaneously (COVID-19 response).
- If Title10/Active Components elements responded to an emergency in Ohio, they can come under the command of the Adjutant General of Ohio through a “**dual-status**” command structure in which the Ohio National Guard retains command of identified military elements operating in Ohio.
- Ohio Army National Guard/Ohio Air National Guard units/individuals can respond to emergencies in other states/territories while in State Active Duty status (gaining state or Federal reimbursement to Ohio for State Active Duty expenses).
- The process for Ohio National Guard units requested and responding out of the state is the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC).
- The State Defense Force is only eligible for State Active Duty not Emergency Management Assistance Compact.
- Title 32 and State Active Duty individual pay rates are similar - based on individual rank/time in service. There are differences in Title 32 and State Active Duty benefits and entitlements (access to TRICARE, eligibility for Post 9/11 GI Bill, and points accrued toward Federal retirement).
- Title 32 and State Active Duty medical coverage and treatment are significantly different. Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force individuals activated under State Active Duty are entitled to Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation for medical treatment and claims.

# STATUS OF FORCES & INDIVIDUALS



## NOTES CONCERNING TITLE STATUS

Title 10/Title 32 pay is processed for Ohio Army National Guard/Ohio Air National Guard members through their existing federal pay system (the system that provides their Inactive Duty Training pay). The transitions from one status to another (monthly duty to emergency response) is a contiguous process as the individual remains within the Federal payroll system.

Units/individuals in the Ohio National Guard are paid under Title 32 for scheduled Inactive Duty Training (weekend training) and Annual Training. Inactive Duty Training is commonly referred to as “drill.”

Units/individuals in the State Defense Force are not compensated for their scheduled training/Inactive Duty Training. They are compensated only during State Active Duty or for specific training.

State Active Duty pay requires the Adjutant General’s Department to establish Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force members within the state of Ohio pay system (OAKS). It is not a seamless process as Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force members are added to the state payroll individually. Issues impacting State Active Duty payroll include delays and not receiving pay:

- Confirming a mailing address for the individual. State Active Duty payroll is sent by mail initially, not by direct deposit (required for Ohio National Guard members - federal pay)
- State Active Duty duty relevant to when state payroll is processed
- Processing time for the Adjutant General’s Department to validated State Active Duty pay rosters and place them into OAKS

# GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

## **ROLE OF THE GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE**

The Government and Public Affairs Office is responsible directly to The Adjutant General of Ohio for liaison and engagement at all levels of government and with other stakeholders. The Government and Public Affairs Office serves as the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard proponent for addressing elected official's inquiries, managing political/organizational communications, and developing political/public affairs policies. Through synchronized communications, interactions, engagements, outreach, and dialogue with state/Federal leaders/legislators, and other stakeholders, the Government and Public Affairs Office shapes awareness and perceptions of the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard (through the Public Affairs Office) while advocating for legislation (appropriations/resources) related to infrastructure, force structure, equipment, and resources for the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard. The Government and Public Affairs Office represents all components of the Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force as they do not have a similar or equivalent authority.

## **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Establishing and coordinating The Adjutant General of Ohio political engagements.
- Promoting Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard/The Adjutant General of Ohio vision, values, ideals, and strategic communications with elected officials, their staff, and other stakeholders.
- Communicating the Adjutant General of Ohio prioritization/intent for Military Construction.
- Addressing National Defense Authorization Act items and legislation.
- Drafting (state) legislation.
- Creating/supporting Adjutant General of Ohio/other legislative testimony.
- Reviewing/assessing (state) legislation impacting the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard.
- Reviewing/assessing Federal legislation impacting the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard.
- Responding to inquiry from state and Federal legislators/others.
- Reviewing and submitting Joint Legislative Ethics Committee documents for Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard individuals.
- Developing policy related to government affairs, politics, inquiries, and stakeholder engagement/management.

# GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

## MANAGING POLITICAL COMMUNICATIONS

The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard creates a broad audience of interested political, private, and public stakeholders/audiences/groups each with specific needs, expectations, and perceptions of the organization. In communicating the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard mission, intentions, and values/ideals the Government and Public Affairs Office serves the Ohio National Guard as an organizational point of contact and coordinator for political and legislative activities.

- For transparency - all subordinate Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard organizations and staff are required to notify the Government and Public Affairs Office of pending or requested elected official visits, inquiries, and requests for information. Though engagements and interactions with elected officials are encouraged, they occur within the framework of the Adjutant General of Ohio awareness, the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard's strategic plan, communication plan, state/Federal guidelines, and with minimal disruption to operations.
- Communication and interaction between the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard and Federal officials/other military components/Federal legislators and staff are reserved for the Adjutant General of Ohio and his designated representatives. All Federal legislative efforts and inquiries are coordinated through the Government and Public Affairs Office.
- Communication and interaction between the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard and the Office of the Governor and state legislators and staff is reserved for The Adjutant General of Ohio and his designated representatives. All state legislative efforts and inquiries are coordinated through the Government and Public Affairs Office.
- Interactions with elected officials, political groups/affiliates, lobbyists, private and/or non-profit organizations are IAW TAG policy 22-005 Political and Legislative Oversight. Private corporations and contractors, to include political/special interest affiliates/individuals, use the Government and Public Affairs Office as an initial point of contact for interactions with the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard or the Adjutant General of Ohio.
- All applications for organizational grants, or participation by OHNG members in grant requests that effect the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard, are coordinated through the Government and Public Affairs Office.

### FACTS

- The General Affairs Officer is the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard's political and legislative point of contact at the Federal and state level.
- The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard has specific procedures for managing interactions, inquiries, and communications with elected officials, politically affiliated individuals, organizations, and programs (encompassing lobbying/grant efforts, and response to inquiries).
- Subordinate Ohio National Guard organizations/individuals are encouraged to engage with local, state, and national level leaders and legislators along clearly defined guidelines that ensure transparency and objectivity.

# GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

## INQUIRIES

Inquiries from elected officials provide Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force members and others the ability to communicate issues, concerns, and requests for information to the Adjutant General of Ohio.

The inquiry process supports and works within the Ohio National Guard/State Defense Force chain of command, but is not meant to circumvent existing processes or the responsibility of the command to respond to legitimate member issues. Additionally, the inquiry process does not preclude members of the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard from seeking answers or redress directly from their command. The inquiry process is based on addressing issues, not expediting decisions nor avoiding established administrative policies.

The itemized congressional/legislative inquiries checklist provides details on the inquiry process. Administrative processing time for an inquiry is within 30 days of receipt pending any requirements to initiate a formal investigation or await a legal process/decision. Freedom of Information Act requests are not part of the inquiry process and are submitted separately through appropriate Federal or state (Public Records Act) channels.



# GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

## INQUIRY CHECKLIST

- The Government Affairs Officer addresses inquiries for **current ADJ/OHNG members**. The GAO can provide limited assistance to former members; the release of available records or documents (OHNG service) is authorized with an individual's signed consent.
- A disclosure statement is required for all inquiries. The statement will include: the full name of the constituent and rank, last four SSN: OHNG/SDF unit of assignment, annotated/signed consent for release of information.
- For former or retired OHNG members, changes to official records are processed through the appropriate component board of corrections - Army Board for Correction of Military Records (ABCMR) or Air Force Board for the Correction of Military Records (BCMR). **The OHNG is not authorized to change/amend documents/records for individuals no longer a member of the OHNG without ABCMR/BCMR consent.**

- For OHNG members serving on T10/AD - the GAO can assist with the inquiry (identifying the unit/proponent), though the responsibility for the inquiry, or any formal/cursory investigation, falls on the gaining (T10/active duty) unit. **This encompasses units/individuals deployed in T10 status, on active duty/T10 for training.**
- Inquiries based on Military Entrance Processing Station (MEPS) decisions or waivers are not the responsibility of the ADJ/OHNG (**MEPS is a DoD program not part of the OHNG or NGB**).
- For former or retired SDF members, the ADJ is authorized to change and/or amend documents for individuals who are no longer members pending the merit of the request.
- All separation documents are completed and placed in the archives contingent upon an individual's release from T10/T32 duty (DD 214), or from the OHNG (NGB-22).
- All documents, to include a disclosure statement, are provided by email/mail to the Government and Public Affairs Office (GPAO). **Phone inquiries are not permissible.**
- Inquiries identify issue(s) and provide detailed information supporting the constituents claim(s) or concerns. This can include information on the point at which a process failed, a request was not answered, or an action was not fulfilled. Details concerning individuals involved, when the issue occurred, and any relevant document(s) provides usable information for the GAO in initiating a comprehensive internal query.
- Inquiries with allegations of criminal intent, sexual assault/ harassment, or other legal concerns can expand the scope and duration of the inquiry. Inquiries can become formal criminal investigations, if warranted (ADJ/OHNG, law enforcement agencies, or other authorities). In these cases, the GAO provides updates/status - however, the administrative process and release of information requirements can change.
- The OHNG cannot initiate or process VA claims. Inquiries or requests for disabled Veterans status are addressed at [www.vamedclaims.com/](http://www.vamedclaims.com/). The OHNG can provide medical documents if the individual was a former OHNG member and the records exist in the archives.
- The OHNG cannot address GI Bill issues. Inquiries pertaining to the GI Bill are referred to <https://benefits.va.gov/gibill/>.
- The OHNG can confirm enrollment and administrative data for TRICARE. TRICARE is a DoD/Defense Health Agency program directly tied to an individual.
- Legal records and sensitive information can be withheld pending a FOIA/Public Records Act request and consent from ADJ/OHNG legal counsel. Classified information above For Official Use Only (FOUO) is not for release to the public or individuals/organizations. Personally Identifiable Information (PII) is not provided through email.



# GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE



## **SPECIAL EVENTS**

The GPAO serves as a point of contact for the Adjutant General of Ohio events where political leaders, legislators, stakeholders, and other key audiences would have interest in participating or attending. The GPAO creates invitations for specific audiences and coordinates public affairs support to each event, as required.

## **CALL TO DUTY (CTD)**

The Call to Duty ceremony is a tradition honoring members deploying under Title 10 activation/mobilization. Based on the sensitivity of the deployment – training and travel timelines, pre-deployment locations, or overseas location(s) may not be immediately released or announced.

## **WELCOME HOME CEREMONY (WHC)**

A Welcome Home Ceremony honors members returning home from Title 10 deployments or other significant events/activations.

## **FACILITY OPENING/UNVEILING**

Openings/unveilings provide stakeholders and the public the opportunity to see appropriations at work. It allows local residents and leaders to understand more about the impact of the Ohio National Guard in their communities.

## **LEGISLATIVE ORIENTATION FLIGHT**

The Legislative Orientation Flight provides state/Federal elected officials and their staff with an overview of the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard. These flights occur annually and include a series of Ohio National Guard capability briefs and demonstrations.

## **ORIENTATION FLIGHT**

Orientation Flight provide other stakeholders, community leaders, and others to experience the capabilities of the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard.

# ADJUTANT GENERAL'S INITIATIVES

## FORCE STRUCTURE

The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard serves the state and the nation by continuing to identify and gain force structure that provides unique capabilities and capacity.

### The intent of gaining current and relevant force structure is threefold:

- Effective force structure provides Ohio with an effective balance of units, resources, equipment, and abilities that do not exist as part of state or local government.
- Current/emerging force structure legitimizes the role of the National Guard as a key component of National Defense Strategy and as a critical part of the operational force.
- Relevant force structure allows the Ohio National Guard to attract and retain a workforce that is on par with their active components in key aspects of training, experience, and skill. It provides tangible economic advantage for Ohio's workforce and our ability to keep talent in Ohio.

## SPACE NATIONAL GUARD (SNG)

Commensurate with the establishment of a United States Space Force, the creation of a reserve space component is appropriate and necessary to ensure that the National Guard remains relevant to National Defense Strategy and is able to leverage the skills, experiences, and abilities of Ohio's Citizen Soldiers/Airmen. The 178th Wing, Springfield, Ohio, currently supports United States Space Force missions. However, the 178th Operations Group is flying a legacy weapon system (MQ-9 Reaper) the Air Force is posturing to divest. This divestiture leaves the wing at risk. The creation of a Space National Guard has real implications for the Ohio Air National Guard and the 178th Wing.

## CYBER (FEDERAL)

The Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard is expanding cyber capabilities across two enterprises. First, the 179th Cyberspace Wing has transitioned from a flying wing to a Cyber Enabled Air Superiority mission (Fully Operation Cabale in 2027). The transition will continue to employ 1,200 members of the Ohio Air National Guard at Mansfield Lahm Airport while generating over \$150 million in capital improvements over the next three to five years - including new construction and improvements to the electric grid, existing facilities, and overall communications infrastructure. The 179th CW is the only Air National Guard wing comprised of cyberspace operations squadrons, a development squadron, and a test detachment under the same command. Additionally, elements of the 178th Wing, Springfield, Ohio (124th, 125th, and 127th Intelligence Squadrons) will provide direct support to the Cyber Enabled Air Superiority mission at the 179th Cyberspace Wing.

# ADJUTANT GENERAL'S INITIATIVES

## STATE DEFENSE FORCE - OHIO CYBER RESERVE

As a state funded enterprise, the continued growth of the Ohio Cyber Reserve (OhCR) and its capacity to support cyber defense, cybersecurity awareness, and workforce development in Ohio is critical in addressing current and emerging threats. As threats to the cyber domain are evolving and persistent, the ability of the OhCR to attract talent from academia and private industry allows the Adjutant General's Department to provide the state of Ohio with a unique capability that is applicable and adaptive. Appropriations for the OhCR and the Ohio Cyber Range is funding spent for the future.

## FIGHTER RECAPITALIZATION

The 180th Fighter Wing possesses the most current F16's (F-16C) in the US Air Force inventory. However, as the Air Force moves to divests the active inventory of all legacy weapon systems, this leaves the 180th Fighter Wing vulnerable. There are 12 Air National Guard fighter squadrons pending the loss of their airframes and flying missions in the next five years. This places these units "uncovered" with no pending replacement. There is currently no feasible plan from the Air Force to upgrade the 180th Fighter Wing to the F-35/F-15X or to re-mission the unit.

## NEXT GENERATION AIR REFUELING SYSTEM (NGAS)

Similar to concerns with the 180th Fighter Wing and F-16C, Air Force efforts to shed aircraft are without defined long-term plans to upgrade Air National Guard airframes and units. The primary focus of the 121st Air Refueling Wing is to remain the leading basing option for the Next Generation Air Refueling System, whether the KC-46A, or other NexGen tanker options. In looking at near-term opportunities for the 121st ARW, their ability to expand into KC-135 pilot and boom-operator training, as the Air Force divests aircraft and associated schooling/training, presents a unique opportunity to capitalize on the unit's expertise and historical readiness.



## ADJUTANT GENERAL'S INITIATIVES



### **MILITARY CONSTRUCTION (MILCON) / SUSTAINMENT, RESTORATION & MODERNIZATION (SRM)**

#### **ADJUTANT GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT/OHIO NATIONAL GUARD**

For domestic missions, roles, and responses military construction and Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization are crucial in gaining and sustaining the force of the future while retaining the ability of the Ohio National Guard to respond to multiple obligations at home and across the nation. Our readiness centers/armories and air wings exist as individual mobilization platforms across the state of Ohio. As such, the importance of functionality cannot be understated. Additionally, our facilities serve as a visible Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard presence in our communities.

#### **OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD**

As most Army facilities exceed 40 years in age - they are incompatible with current/ emerging technology, square footage requirements for personnel and equipment, and do not have the capacity to support our fully integrated work-force (male/female showers/restrooms). In many instances, either by sheer facility age or mounting deferred maintenance, Ohio Army National Guard infrastructure is rapidly eroding and impacting overall readiness and response capacity.

#### **OHIO AIR NATIONAL GUARD**

The challenge for the Air is to ensure that facilities keep pace with the rate of change occurring in the Air Force based on emerging missions and gaining new capabilities. As the 179<sup>th</sup> CW in Mansfield transitions to a cyberspace wing, the 121st Air Refueling Wing looks toward the next generation tanker, and the 180th FW fits into the future Air Force, ensuring that Ohio Air National Guard facilities have the requisite capacity for change and ability to modernize is crucial. Not having adequate or agile facilities will have a negative effect on Ohio Air National Guard selection for new missions and roles.

# KEY CAPABILITIES

## STATE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (SPP)

### HUNGARY

The State Partnership Program with the Hungary Ministry of Defense began in 1993 as part of the European Reassurance Initiative. The program’s intent was to partner with former Warsaw Pact/Soviet Influenced nations in Eastern Europe as a stability initiative. Key areas of engagement include Cybersecurity; Chaplain Training; Non-Lethal Peace Keeping Focus Training and Exercises; Intelligence Training; Chemical, Biological, Nuclear, and Radiological training; Disaster Preparedness Response Training; Senior Leader Collaborations; Military Professional Development; and Aviation Planning/Support Training.

### SERBIA

As an extension of the State Partnership Program Hungarian partnership, the Ohio National Guard gained Serbia as a partner in 2006. Similar to the types of engagements executed with the Hungarian Ministry of Defense, the Serbian relationship also produced a trilateral engagement with the Angolan Armed Forces to create the first combined medical engagement between the three militaries (2017) in the Republic of Angola.

## KEY CAPABILITIES



### **HOMELAND SECURITY AND HOMELAND DEFENSE**

The Ohio National Guard provides analysts and administrative support to Ohio's Counter-narcotics Strategy and Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force. As part of funding gained through the NDAA, the Counterdrug Program provided 39 Soldiers and 23 Airmen to assist Federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies involving work with forensics and criminal case management in 2023. In August 2023, the program was recognized for their consistent support to drug enforcement agencies and activities by the Prevention Action Alliance.

### **CYBER DEFENSE (FEDERAL/OHIO NATIONAL GUARD)**

To support domestic cyber response, the Adjutant General's Department/Ohio National Guard is committed to obtaining additional Federal and state force structure to increase our cyber mission capabilities. These efforts include:

#### **OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD CYBER PROTECTION TEAM**

Conducts defensive cyber operations including vulnerability assessments, critical infrastructure assessment, and FEMA support. The team is comprised of 39 personnel from the Ohio, Indiana, and Michigan National Guard.

#### **OHIO NATIONAL GUARD DEFENSIVE CYBER OPERATIONS TEAM**

Implements defensive measures on Department of Defense and non- Department of Defense networks.

#### **251<sup>ST</sup> CYBERSPACE ENGINEERING INSTALLATION GROUP (178<sup>TH</sup> WING)**

Provides a strategic level cyber infrastructure management element to large geographic areas with higher level management of cyber assets.

#### **269<sup>TH</sup> COMBAT COMMUNICATIONS SQUADRON (178<sup>TH</sup> WING)**

Extends cyberspace networks with commercial and military satellite systems and network infrastructure components in a deployed environment.

#### **220<sup>TH</sup> ENGINEERING INSTALLATION SQUADRON (121<sup>ST</sup> AIR REFUELING WING)**

Provides strategic/geographic level engineering, installation, and communication management of cyber infrastructure.

## KEY CAPABILITIES

### **124<sup>TH</sup> INTELLIGENCE SQUADRON (178<sup>TH</sup> WING)**

Provides Signal Intelligence (SIGINT) based adversary network analysis supporting cyber mission teams.

### **COMPANY C, 837<sup>TH</sup> ENGINEER BATTALION (37<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY BRIGADE COMBAT TEAM)**

Extends cyberspace networks with military satellite systems and network infrastructure components in a deployed environment.

### **137<sup>TH</sup> SIGNAL COMPANY (371<sup>ST</sup> SUSTAINMENT BRIGADE)**

Extends cyberspace networks with military satellite systems and network infrastructure components in a deployed environment.

### **1137<sup>TH</sup> SIGNAL COMPANY (16<sup>TH</sup> ENGINEER BRIGADE)**

Provides installation, recovery, repair, and maintenance of telecommunications network lines and infrastructure.

## **CYBER DEFENSE (STATE/STATE DEFENSE FORCE)**

The Ohio Cyber Reserve provides significant civilian industry expertise as organized teams with the capability to support any number of cyber incidents. The teams are prepared to respond to cyber attacks and incidents within Ohio upon requests from municipal governments, state agencies, and other entities as approved by the Governor. The Ohio Cyber Reserve has responded to two State Active Duty events since 2020.

## **THE OHIO CYBER COLLABORATION COMMITTEE (OC3)**

Provides a cooperative environment among key cyber stakeholders including educators, businesses, and local government. OC3 is supported by a “whole of government” approach to ensure its success. Primary sponsors are the Ohio Department of Higher Education, the Adjutant General’s Department/Ohio National Guard, Department of Administrative Services, and Department of Public Safety. The goal of the OC3 is to strengthen cyber security for all of Ohio and develop a stronger cyber security infrastructure. The OC3 has subcommittees to assist it in achieving its primary goals:

- Charter and Governance Public Awareness.
- Education/Workforce Development.
- Cyber Range.
- Cyber Protection and Preparedness.
- Cyber Ranges (University of Akron and University of Cincinnati) funded by the Adjutant General’s Department
- Provide a secure training environment for the current and future cybersecurity workforce, including the Adjutant General’s Department/Ohio National Guard, state/local government, faculty/students, and private sector entities. The ranges provide a secure cybersecurity test and training environment with the intent to:
- Conduct cybersecurity exercises and competitions to hone cross organizational incident response capabilities and develop future cybersecurity professionals.
- Research and test industry-standard best practices.
- Facilitate the evaluation and testing of innovative technologies and processes.

# KEY CAPABILITIES

## **CIVIL SUPPORT TEAM (52<sup>ND</sup> CST)**

The 52nd Civil Support Team has 22 full-time, Federally funded members of the Ohio Army National Guard and Ohio Air National Guard, all of whom are certified hazardous materials technicians, confined space/rope rescue trained and Incident Command System and National Incident Management System proficient. The Civil Support Team supports civil authorities at domestic Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and high-yield Explosives and natural disaster incidents by assessing current and projected consequences, identifying CBRNE agents/substances, advising on response measures, and assisting with appropriate requests for state and Federal support. The Civil Support Team conducts extensive training on CBRNE threats, equipment operation and agency coordination for reach back capability.



## **THE TEAM IS MADE UP OF SIX SECTIONS**

### **COMMUNICATIONS**

Provides secure and unsecured phone, fax and Internet interoperability between the Civil Support Team, local and state emergency response agencies, lead Federal agencies and supporting military activities.

### **LOGISTICS/ADMINISTRATIVE**

Sustains unit operations for 72 hours, resupplies upon request, monitors and tracks all equipment, coordinates resources with other agencies and calculates incident costs.

### **SURVEY**

Validates the exclusionary zone, conducts reconnaissance of incident target with detailed plans, photographs and collects samples of hazards or intelligence in the hot zone.

### **OPERATIONS**

Tracks all incident events, conducts threat analysis, creates plume models and performs termination planning.

### **MEDICAL AND ANALYTICAL**

Provides CST medical support, facilitates the occupational health and safety program, coordinates for local medical support from available treatment facilities and hospitals, initiates medical air evacuation and prepares initial medical assessments. Analytical personnel conduct presumptive sample analysis in a mobile laboratory.

### **COMMAND**

Conducts interagency coordination, scene safety and coordination with the Incident Command Post.



# KEY CAPABILITIES

## HOMELAND RESPONSE FORCE (HRF)

The Ohio National Guard Homeland Defense Force is a 600 member unit comprised of Ohio National Guard Soldiers and Airmen tasked and organized from existing Ohio Army National Guard/Ohio Air National Guard units to provide specialized Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and high-yield Explosives consequence management capabilities to local, state, or Federal authorities. Homeland Defense Force units are part of a larger national Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and high-yield Explosives consequence management force that can deploy as a national asset. The Homeland Defense Force is provided special training and equipment to plan and conduct casualty search and extraction, emergency medical triage/treatment/patient stabilization, and mass casualty decontamination in a contaminated or uncontaminated environment in support of Incident Command. Units assigned to the Ohio National Guard Homeland Defense Force continue to perform their assigned primary missions. When requested, the unit responds to an incident of state or national level significance to provide the critical assets/resources/expertise to support the incident commander's incident action plan objectives. A security element is also assigned to provide cordon and entry control point support as well as additional personnel for activities such as casualty evacuation and triage. A security element is a dedicated component of the organization.



# OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD UNITS



All Ohio National Guard organizations/units have an established size determined by authorized force structure (allocated positions by rank, identified by a specific category, function, and qualification). The authorized strength of a unit is determined by the component (Army/Air Force) and is open-source information, publicly available. The term end-strength describes the current authorization. The actual strength of a unit is restricted information and not releasable. Units, in some instances, can exceed their authorized strength.

Company (Co), Troop (Trp.), Battery (Btry)	80-200 Soldiers; provides command and control for 2-4 platoons.
Detachment (Det)	An element typically with less Soldiers than a company/troop/battery.
Headquarters (HQ)	Designates the command and administrative proponent for the organization.

## OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD UNITS

### **JOINT FORCE HEADQUARTERS–OHIO (JFHQ)**

The Ohio National Guard is organized under a joint Army and Air National Guard structure with the Adjutant General of Ohio commanding. The Joint Force Headquarters provides executive level command and control of the Ohio National Guard, it serves as the command center for all State Defense Force and as a fully integrated joint staff for the Ohio Army National Guard, Ohio Air National Guard, and State Defense Force. The Joint Force Headquarters provides administrative, human resource, operations, logistics, communications, legal, fiscal, and public affairs support to the entire Ohio National Guard to include other programs and services related to wellness, military families, education, and facilities. The Joint Force Headquarters serves as the proponent for developing and implementing policy and regulations and for generating readiness (managing the availability of personnel, resources, and assets required to respond to national and state level mission or emergencies).



# OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD UNITS

## SPECIAL TROOPS COMMAND (Provisional) (STC)



Special Troops Command (Provisional) provides the command element for the Ohio Army National Guard while supporting subordinate units in administering, sustaining, and managing training centers. In addition to providing the Army element to the Joint Force Headquarters, the STC oversees the Ohio Army National Guard's training center for Ohio Soldiers and other National Guard units/personnel in resident instruction. The instruction encompasses formal leadership and reserve training, professional development, and occupational skills for specific Army positions/specialties. The STC is responsible for recruiting and retention of the Ohio Army National Guard through personnel.

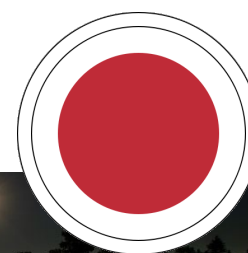

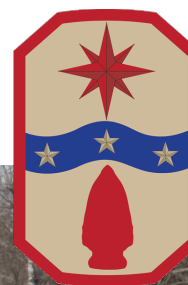

<b>Wing</b>	900-1,200 Airmen; has a distinct mission with a specific scope, made up of one or more groups, consisting of several squadrons.
<b>Group</b>	400-900 Airmen; consists of two or more squadrons.
<b>Squadron</b>	Several dozen up to several hundred Airmen; considered the basic unit in the Air Force/Air National Guard; consists of 2-6 flights.
<b>Flight</b>	About 12 to over 100 Airmen.
<b>Detachment</b>	An element typically with fewer Airmen than a squadron, with the same mission capabilities as its parent squadron.
<b>Geographically Separated Unit (GSU)</b>	A base, physically separate from, yet not autonomous of its "parent" base. GSUs are "owned" by their parent organization and have a small amount of personnel.

# GLOSSARY

<b>AC</b> (Active Component)	Describes all Department of Defense forces under the direct authority of the President. The AC comprises the US Army (USA), US Navy (USN), United States Marine Corps (USMC), and the US Air Force (USAF).
<b>AGR</b> (Active Guard/Reserve)	The full-time National Guard staff managing the organization. They provide continuous support to traditional guard members who serve in a part-time status (see IDT and AT).
<b>AW</b> (Air Wing)	The term used to identify the largest subordinate OHANG units. There are four AW in the OHANG.
<b>ATAG</b> (The Assistant Adjutant General)	There are two ATAGs, one for the Ohio Army National Guard and one for the Ohio Air National Guard.
<b>AT</b> (Annual Training)	Refers to the annual two-three week military training that members of the OHNG attend. This period is formally recognized as Annual Training.
<b>BDE</b> (Brigade) and <b>BN</b> (Battalion)	US Army/US Marine Corps term for an organization consisting of 1,000-3,500 members. Brigades are comprised of subordinate Battalions consisting of 200-1,000 members.
<b>CODEL</b> (Congressional Delegation)	Congressional Delegation, the term we use to identify staff members for a state or Federal senator/representative.
<b>CTD</b> (Call to Duty ceremony)	The CTD ceremony is a tradition honoring members deploying under T10 orders. Based on the sensitivity of the deployment – training and travel timelines, pre-deployment location(s), or overseas location(s) may not be immediately released or announced.
<b>Demobilization</b> (DEMOB)	Refers to the process of transitioning from T10 status to T32 at the end of a mobilization/deployment.
<b>Drill and IDT</b> (Inactive Duty Training)	Refers to the monthly weekend military training that members of the OHNG attend. This period is formally recognized as Inactive Duty Training (IDT).
<b>Dual Status Technician</b> (DST)	Describes those National Guard members that serve as Federal technicians in a full-time (uniformed) status. Their participation as a dual status employee is based on their traditional membership in the National Guard. Dual Status is often referred to as Technician.
<b>Inquiry</b>	The official request from a legislator on the behalf of a constituent.
<b>MSC</b> (Major Subordinate Command)	One of six brigade size organizations that comprise the Ohio Army National Guard.
<b>Mobilization</b>	Refers to the process of transitioning from T32 status to T10 status in preparation for deployment under Federal control. Alert for State Active Duty (SAD) is also considered a mobilization or activation.
<b>NG</b> (National Guard)	Describes the organized, Federally sanctioned military forces under the Governor's control in all 54 state and territories.
<b>RC</b> (Reserve Component)	Describes all Department of Defense forces under the direct authority of the President, but active only in a part time status (similar to the National Guard). All of the active components have a RC equivalent.
<b>SJA</b> (Staff Judge Advocate) and <b>JAG</b> (Judge Advocate General)	Refers to military legal counsel. The term JAG (Judge Advocate General) is also used as a term for military lawyers/counsel.
<b>SDF</b> (State Defense Force)	A quasi-military organization under the Adjutant General's Department, comprising (none of these state components are affiliated with the DoD or active components of the US military): OHMR (Ohio Military Reserve) OHNM (Ohio Naval Militia) OhCR (Ohio Cyber Reserve)
<b>TAG</b> (The Adjutant General)	The Adjutant General (TAG) commands the Ohio National Guard and is either a member of the Ohio Army or Air National Guard.
<b>T10</b>	A Federal active status for US military members. Members of the National Guard serve in this status while mobilized. All active component members are in a Title 10 (T10) status.
<b>T32</b>	A Federal status to temporarily bring National Guard members onto a full-time/active-duty status. This status is used for National Guard members participating in IDT or AT. It can also be used during national emergencies and other events.
<b>WHC</b> (Welcome Home Ceremony)	These events serve to honor Ohio National Guard members returning home from a deployment.

## INSTALLATION STATUS REPORT (ISR)

This report is used to evaluate and rate the quality and ability of a building/facility to support the unit's mission. It is based on Army standards and applied to OHARNG buildings and facilities.

### MISSION RATINGS

Provides a ranking based on how well the unit can perform its mission based on the facility. Inspections are conducted on a rotating schedule with 20% of OHARNG buildings/structures inspected every year.

#### F1 GOOD

Building/facility is able to support function with reasonable maintenance.

#### F2 ADEQUATE

Building/facility requires minimal restoration/modernization funds to adequately support the function.

#### F3 POOR

Building/facility requires significant restoration/modernization funds to adequately support the function.

#### F4 FAILING

Building/facility requires major restoration/modernization funds to adequately support the function.

### QUALITY RATINGS

Describes current state of building/facility and estimates costs of improving the building/facility against replacement.

#### Q1 GOOD

Estimated cost to improve building/structure is less than 10% of estimated replacement value. Most, or all, components of the building/structure meets or exceeds Army standards.

#### Q2 ADEQUATE BASELINE

Estimated cost to improve building/structure is no more than 20% of the replacement value. Condition of the building/structure meets the minimum level of Army standards for most or all rated components.

#### Q3 POOR

Estimated cost to improve building/structure is significant, but no more than 40% of replacement cost.

#### Q4 FAILING

Estimated cost to improve building/structure requires major restoration/modernization funds exceeding 40% of replacement value.

### CAPACITY C-RATING

Based on type of unit

The C-rating is essential in determining if the building/facility is sufficiently sized for the organization(s)/unit(s) occupying it.

Evaluates current capacity (square footage) of the building/facility against what the Army requires to support the number of personnel and items of equipment assigned to the organization/unit.

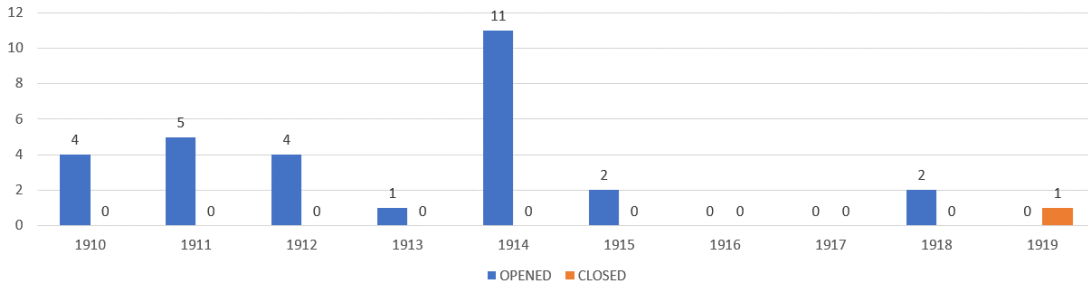
# ARMORIES DATA

- Armory is defined as a new facility built with state, federal or matching dollars for the purpose of an OHNG/OHARNG unit. Generally, all new construction prior to WWII was 100% state. All new construction after WWII began to increase to state/federal percentage.
- Facilities acquired after construction or transferred from another agency (State, DOD, USAR or USAF), or acquired through purchase or lease (e.g. Medina, Kenton, Ada), is not counted. Concurrently, facilities that meet this description are not counted in closure. Examples would include Shaker Heights Cavalry Armory, RANGB buildings, Medina, etc.
- Close dates are based on the removal of all OHANRG force structure from that facility based on EDATES published in official organizational authorities. Some facilities were mothballed and disposed of later or are used by organizations other than the OHNG (i.e. Sullivant Ave. use as OHMR armory).
- Other construction, such as maintenance shops, UTES, flight facilities, RTI's or other buildings are not used here.

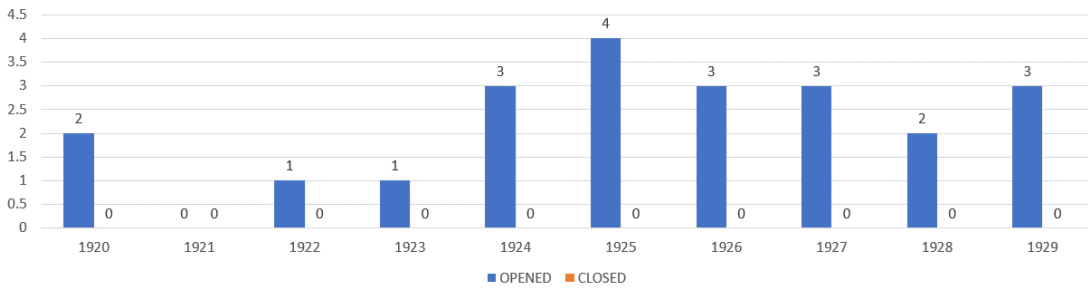
